From the Front Cover

The Holy Apostle Ananias of the Seventy (October 1), was the first Bishop of Damascus. While serving there, the Lord ordered him to restore the sight of Saul, the former persecutor of Christians, then baptize him (Acts 9:10-19, 22:12). Saul would go on to become the great preacher and Apostle Paul. In addition to this, St Ananias boldly and openly confessed Christianity before the Jews and the pagans of Damascus, despite great danger.

The following from the Acts of the Apostles, is the interaction between Ananias and Saul (Paul)

"Now there was a disciple at Damascus named Anani'as. The Lord said to him in a vision, "Anani'as." And he said, "Here I am, Lord." And the Lord said to him, "Rise and go to the street called Straight, and inquire in the house of Judas for a man of Tarsus named Saul; for behold, he is praying, land he has seen a man named Anani' as come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight." But Anani'as answered, "Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to thy saints at Jerusalem; and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who call upon thy name." But the Lord said to him, "Go, for he is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before the Gentiles and kings and the sons of Israel; for I will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name." So Anani'as departed and entered the house. And laying his hands on him he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road by which you came, has sent me that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes and he regained his sight. Then he rose and was baptized, and took food and was strengthened." Acts 9: 10-19

From Damascus St. Ananias went to preach at Eleutheropolis, where he healed many of their infirmities. However, Lucian, the prefect of the city, tried to persuade the holy one to offer sacrifice to idols. But because of Ananias' staunch and solid confession of Christ, Lucian ordered that he be tortured. Nevertheless, harsh torments did not sway the Witness of Truth. Then the torturers led him out beyond the city, where they stoned him. In the midst of this, the Saint prayed for those who put him to death. His relics were later transferred to Constantinople.

Beloved Clergy and Faithful of our Archdiocese:

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We pray that you all enjoyed a peaceful and relaxing summer and are working hard as we begin a new ecclesiastical year. 2023 marks the 100th anniversary of our Antiochian Archdiocese. While St. Raphael of Brooklyn established our presence here in 1895 as the Syro-Arab Mission of the Russian Orthodox Church, 1923 is when we became incorporated as an archdiocese of the Patriarchate of Antioch and all the East. These ties were reaffirmed this past summer between our clergy and laity and the Mother Church by the archpastoral visit of our father in Christ, His Beatitude Patriarch JOHN X.

With that in mind, we bring to your attention that October in the Antiochian Archdiocese is "Youth Month and Seminary Month". This year we have 25 official seminarians studying in five seminaries, including our own Antiochian House of Studies. Most of our students will serve this Archdiocese as priests in the future. Prayer

The Cure for Our Disordered State



Man is living in a perpetual state of disorder, far from the ordered life God intended for him. The cure for this disordered state is to be found in prayer. It is in the foundation of prayer that we seek out the healing that will restore us to the image that God intended at the moment of creation. Prayer is the yearning of the soul towards the image of its prototype. When we are purified by God's grace, it is an attraction of like to like. We are deified by contact with the Creator, returned to an ordered state, and made whole.

We can achieve nothing by our own efforts alone; yet if we commit ourselves to a prayer rule, and stick with it, the Lord will reward us with an abundance of grace, and we will be restored to the ordered life we were intended to enjoy. Just as it takes two men, cooperating with one another, to move a broken down old car to the side of the road for repairs, so too much we cooperate with God, if we are to be made whole.

Someone once complained to me that he wasn't sure there was anything to this "God thing", sharing he had real doubts as to whether any of the Church's teachings were true. I pointed out that he was hardly cooperating with the cure for his illness, since his church attendance was erratic, and his prayer life non-existent.

You do not take a woman out for dinner, refuse to engage her in conversation, and expect her to accept an invitation for another date. Likewise, if we want to learn about the things of God, we will show up for services, read books on Orthodoxy, and otherwise avail ourselves to the healing that takes place within the Church. A relationship with God, like in any human relationship, depends on our own commitment, for a relationship is dependent on both parties' active participation.

Apolytikion of the Righteous Father Romanos in Tone 8



Work Continues at Saint Mary's

- Over the past several weeks, the tiles and carpeting in the church have replaced. Porcelain tiles and new baseboards have been placed in the Church Narthex, Solea and Altar. New carpeting has been installed in the Sanctuary and Sacristy.
- Three new 'split units' have replaced aging existing ones, with three to four new units needed in the near future.
- Painting and repair to the covered walkway between the church and hall, as well as installation of new lighting is in the final stages of completion.
